St Bernadette's Safeguarding Requirements

The Archdiocese of Sydney is wholly committed to ensuring the safety, well-being and dignity of all children, and acknowledges its important legal, moral and spiritual responsibility to create a safe and nurturing environment for those children." - https://www.sydneycatholic.org/royal-commission/#commitmentstatement

All volunteers and staff (paid or unpaid) in Sydney Archdiocese parishes, including St Bernadette's, must comply with the following safeguarding requirements:

- 1. Working with Children Check (WWCC):
 - Must be renewed every 5 years.
 - Submit your WWCC and date of birth to the St Bernadette's Safeguarding Officer.

2. Volunteer Registration-Acceptance Form:

- Complete and submit the form.
- Update it as needed to reflect role changes.
- 3. Code of Conduct for Working with Children:
 - Read and sign the document.
 - Submit the signed copy. You may keep a copy for your reference
- 4. Safeguarding Induction Training (Online):
 - Complete the Archdiocesan training.
 - Submit your training certificate.

Important:

- All required documents must be submitted to safeguarding@stbernadettescarlton.org.au before starting or continuing volunteer work.
